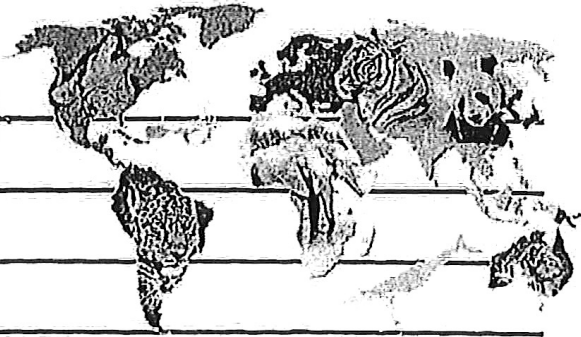


We should save Burrowing
